Prior Knowledge

KS1: The children have studied the questions-Why do Christmas and Easter matter to Christians? What is the 'good news' Christians believe Jesus brings?

In KS2, they have completed work on the questions- What is the 'Trinity' and why is it important to Christians? Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'? What kind of world did Jesus want?

Why do some people choose not to have God as 'king' in their life?



My Component Knowledge:

Lesson 1: I can represent the 'Kingdom of God' that Christians believe Jesus wanted on Earth.

Lesson 2: I can retell the events of the Pentecost story.

Lesson 3: I can describe what Christians believe the Holy Spirit is like.

Lesson 4: I can explain what the 'Kingdom of God' would be like if the God described by Christians did rule.

Lesson 5: I understand that some people have different beliefs.

Lesson 6: I can recognise ways Christians celebrate the church's birthday and explain why Pentecost is an important event for Christians and how they believe God wanted the world to be.
