Class 1 - Mrs Betts

So lovely to see all the children back this week and hear about all the fantastic things they did over the half-term.

This week we have begun our new English sequence '*The Hidden Ocean*' (lift the flap book) by Libby Waldon. The children will be using this as a model for creating their own lift the flap book. In drawing club, reception have been using '*Superkid*' by Claire Freeman as inspiration for their writing.

In maths reception have been focusing on doubles and doubling. They have played dominoes, been on number matching hunts and played games involving doubles. *I wonder if you can explain doubling.*

Year 1 have started their new unit on Place Value within 100, we have been looking at partitioning numbers into tens and ones using part-whole models. *Can you explain a part-whole model using 59?*

Year 2 are finishing up their unit on Properties of Shape, – *Can you explain a vertices, edges and faces on a 3d shape*?

In ICT we are learning to program using Scratch Junior, creating sprites, backgrounds and movement commands. In History, we are starting out new topic on Food and how it has changed overtime.

In RE, the children will be learning about what it is like to live in a faith community.

In science this week, class one have been creating the seasons from various materials.

In PE, we have been practising athletics sharpening up our skills ready for sports day!

Class 2 - Mrs Godly

It has been great to see everyone as we come back to school and spend longer outside during the day, let's hope the weather continues.

The children have started a new sequence of learning all about 'Mighty Machines'. We are using the text, '*Ripley's Believe it or not! Mighty Machines*' by Ian Graham. This is a non-fiction text all about the 'weird and whacky machines' that have been invented. The children have been looking at the page layouts, recording facts about a vehicle they are interested in and making a bookmark for it as well as working in pairs to learn and remember a page from the text.

In maths lessons, Years 3 and 4 have been continuing with their work on time. They have been finding and comparing durations of time and using the 24 hour clock to extend this learning further. Years 5 and 6 have been started a unit of work on coordinates (Geometry). Year 5 have been working with coordinates in the first quadrant and Year 6 have been working with all four quadrants. *Can they explain what a quadrant is?*

As it is the beginning of this half term, the children have been completing their elicitation tasks, to see what they can remember from their previous learning. They have been introduced to the Industrial Revolution, discussed their RE units and started their science units. Years 3 and 4 have set up their plant experiment that will last until the end of term (more about this to follow later) and Years 5 and 6 completed an experiment to see what liquids can clean a tarnished coin the best. We also realised you cannot carry out the Coke/Mento experiment with flat coke!













FOREST SCHOOL



Forest School Chocolate Brownies

This recipe originally came from a Kings Nympton School recipe book from 10 years ago. The recipe was submitted by Deborah at the Grove Inn, but I have added a few more chocolate chips!

Ingredients

300g golden caster sugar

250g butter

200g plain chocolate -melted

50g milk chocolate - chopped into gravel

50 g white chocolate - sized pieces

3 large eggs plus 1 extra egg yolk (or a splash of milk)

60g plain flour

60g cocoa powder

1/2 tsp baking powder

23 x 23cm baking tin



- 1. Line baking tin with baking parchment.
- 2. Beat sugar and butter until creamy.
- 3. Beat eggs in a bowl and add slowly.
- 4. Stir in melted and chopped chocolate.
- 5. Fold in flour, cocoa and baking powder.
- 6. Scrape into prepared cake tin.
- 7. Place in Dutch oven and sit on the fire, cover top of oven with fire also.
- 8. Cook for approximately 35 minutes, checking after 25 minutes. This needs a slow fire rather than a raging fire.

Alternatively, cook at 180/ 160 degrees fan for 30 minutes. . Cake should have risen slightly but still be soft in the middle.

Should I keep my child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit

• Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
