

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS



In drawing club this week we have been innovating and extending 'We're going on a bear hunt' by Michael Rosen. The children have come up with some exciting ideas about how the bear could get up to the first floor window, how the family could get across the flooded river and how we could warn other people to keep safe.

In maths, Year 1 and 2 we have been continuing their learning of addition. First by adding two amounts together, and then by thinking about adding more. We are also learning doubles and how these help us with near doubles. Reception have been making repeating patterns in lots of different contexts.

In RE this week, we have been learning about what God means to Christians and the meaning of forgiveness. How it helps others' and ourselves. The children made God's loving arms as a symbol of his forgiveness.

In Geography, the children learned about Northern Ireland, as part of their United Kingdom topic. We even had a go at some Irish dancing.

We would like to say a big thank you to all the marvellous bakers and buyers of all the wonderful cakes. It will enable us to buy a special treat on our school trip.

In English Class Two have been working hard to create their instructions for their chosen activity. We have been learning about revising drafts and editing, checking for spelling, punctuation, grammar and presentation.

In maths, Year 3 and 4 we have been focusing on column addition and subtraction. First by adding two amounts together without carrying over, and then by thinking about adding more, and subtracting without the need to exchange and then with. Year 5 and 6 have had their own challenges but have worked hard on prime numbers with the aid of factor flowers and also have looked at square and cube numbers.

We have continued our work in geography by looking this week at the continent of Africa. We were amazed by how many countries there are and what a big area the continent covers, and really enjoyed looking at the country's flags.

We are approaching the end of our units in art but as the Mexican God's Eyes were such a hit during our Mexico Day the children designed some patterns before making them a reality, and we all found the process very therapeutic.

Year 3, 4 and 5 are fortunate to enjoy their second trip of the term to forest school this week which means that Year 6 can have an opportunity to focus on things that will be needed for their SATS later in the school year as well as having some fun in Golden Time.

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
