#### Class 1 - Mrs Betts

This week the Faithful Friends have been stuck at Lava Lake, and we have had to work our imaginations hard. Hopefully, we have done enough to power the magic portal. We have been using Little Red Riding Hood to inspire our story telling. The children have created their own characters, setting and ending. In one version, Grandma lives in a caravan!

In maths, have been learning about addition and subtraction. Reception have been focusing on numbers to 5: subitising and comparing.

In our foundation subjects we have been learning to play the recorder, looking at world maps and learning the continents and oceans and in RE, we have been thinking about gratitude and what it means to be a creator. In PE, we have been perfecting our skills for target games and, on Friday's learning movement skills in gymnastics.

#### Class 2- Ms Rae

What a lovely week Class 2 have had! Monday gave us the opportunity to talk to each other about what we got up to last Friday whilst at Winkleigh. It was lovely to hear all of their experiences.

We continued our work in English with all of us looking at persuasive techniques and using descriptive language to paint vivid images and sell our ideas to people.

In maths both Year 3 & 4 and Year 6 are all working on the second part of multiplication and division, with Year 3 and 4 looking at factor pairs, multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 as well as reasoning, and Year 6 were looking at efficient division and soling multi-step problems.

In geography we looked at the village of Kings Nympton and out to the wider area, Devon and the UK. We learnt skills needed to read Ordnance Survey maps and found it really interesting to see just how small Kings Nympton is in comparison to Chulmleigh and South Molton.

Science saw us looking at what we eat, understanding herbivores, omnivores and carnivores as well as what food chains are and about producers, consumers, predators and prey.

We are continuing to focus on hockey in PE which resulted in a big improvement in the skills we learnt last week and there was some very impressive dribbling efforts.

We also continued preparing for our batik work by experimenting in wax resist and this produced some lovely pieces of work and proved to be a hit with the whole class

It will be great to spend another day at Winkleigh and to experience learning in larger classes.

# Should I keep my child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hour after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scables	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit

• Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
