Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

This week in Owls Class the children have been learning about the Hindu festival of Diwali. They have enjoyed re-telling the story through dance as well as in their smallworld play.

On Wednesday they worked so well together in teams to create their own rangoli patterns using coloured sand, and on Thursday they enjoyed making Diva lamps using clay!

They are continuing to work hard on their phonics, putting sounds together to build words as well as continuing to practise their tricky words. A list of these tricky words has been sent home for children to continue working on at home. I am sure they will tell you how we practise them at school by sticking them on doors, using them as flashcards and playing target games with them too! *Have fun at home creating your own games to practise these words Owls*.

Year 1— Mrs Keast

This week year one took their first steps at becoming authors. We looked at what a story map is and how it can help us tell a story. We then took our brilliant drawings and rhymes from last week and started to write our own version of the book *Oi Frog*!

In Maths we have been learning about fact families and the different ways in which they can be written in a number sentence. We have deepened our understanding of subtraction through using manipulatives to demonstrate what happens when we 'take- away' and what we have left. We have also learned about the method of "counting back" on a number line to find the answers to subtraction calculations.

In RE this week, we discussed the story of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem. We heard the story told in several different ways and thought about the main events in the story. Some fantastic drawings from the children, depicting the stable scene from the story.



Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have had a great week in the various weathers we have experienced!

On Wednesday, we got our coats on and enjoyed exploring the hail before the sun shone through!

English has seen us work together on a shared piece of writing, based on our stimulus of the 'Man on the Moon' Christmas advert. We have been thinking about how we can convey the story without rushing through, adding and enhancing our work with detail.

In maths, we have been busy identifying 2D and 3D shapes. We created our own shape museum exhibition on Monday to show off our knowledge! We followed this by learning about how many sides and vertices shapes have.

History involved learning more about the legacy and significance of Matthew Henson.

On Monday, we enjoyed seeing the Sleeping Beauty pantomime from M&M Productions, getting us ready to visit Plymouth's Theatre Royal in January!

Year 3— Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

Year 3s have begun their new teaching sequence of *Mog's Christmas calamity* and with the snow this week it is feeling a bit Christmassy!

They have continued to work on multiplication and learning times tables. There is no wrong way to teach these, by rhyme, singing or just saying numbers. Any way that helps is a way to learn! They have been introduced to a times table grid, they are liking using this and comparing the patterns times tables make on a hundred grid to make patterns.

They loved the pantomime at the beginning of the week, it was such fun!

Those who made it in today had more of a relaxed day.

We will be hoping to head over to QE on Monday still, but please keep an eye on notifications as this could change at short notice. Stay warm and safe.







Year 4—Mr Walter

Year 4 have engaged further with their English sequence of *Varjak Paw*. This week, we have been looking into the differences of fact and belief while using dictionary skills to learn definitions for words within the story. We shared some fantastic examples of letters that Varjak sent back to a member of his family regarding his experiences in the big city.

In maths, we have been continuing our look into various multiples to understand how to times and divide them with confidence.

In science, we enjoyed creating our own experiment to show the water cycle. We used our planned instructions to help us conduct the experiment step by step.

Our latest visit from M&M productions on Monday afternoon was well received by everyone when watching and engaging with Sleeping Beauty.

Hopefully everyone had a safe and enjoyable day in the snow.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

This week Year 5 have continued with their fraction work in Maths and have been adding fractions both with the same denominators and some when the denominators are different. We have been converting them to make the denominators the same and then adding them together.

In English, we have been learning more about Kensuke from our book and how he ended up on the island. We have then planned a newspaper article about how Kensuke got onto the island and how he helped keep Michael alive. We have been identifying features of a newspaper and their role. The children have started to write their articles, although this was interrupted by the snow.

In Science, we have been learning about what material would be the most effective insulator and planned an experiment to test different materials and which one would keep the ice the coldest.

In History, we have been learning about two men from the Victorian period, Dr Barnado and Lord Shaftesbury and what they did for Victorian children and how they helped improve standards for children.

Year 6—Miss McLean

This week got off to a brilliant start with M&M productions coming in on Monday afternoon, the children loved their performance of Sleeping Beauty.

Year Six have particularly enjoyed their English sequence this week. They have been writing diary entries in the style of our focus text 'My Secret War Diary'. The children have practiced writing in different styles such as diary entries, newspaper reports and letters.

In maths, we have continued working with fractions by adding and subtracting mixed numbers and improper fractions with different denominators.

In science this week, the children had a go at making electrical circuits and predicting what would happen when another component is added or taken away. They used key vocabulary to support them when making predictions and experimenting.

Finally, I hope that everyone stayed safe and warm in the snow on Thursday and managed to get out and enjoy it! Have a brilliant weekend!

Wraparound Care

Flexible before and after school care available Monday to Friday each week during term time, with nutritious breakfasts and healthy snacks provided as well as appropriately supervised fun activities and games. Everybody is welcome, from Nursery to Year 6 with a range of different activities to suit the different age groups.

Early Birds

Early Birds Breakfast Club runs from 7.45am to 9.00am everyday. You may book as many days as you require. There are two options to choose, either with breakfast for £5.30 per session, or without breakfast for £4.30 per session.







All Sorts

All Sorts After School Club runs from 3.30pm to 5.30pm every day. You may book regular or ad-hoc sessions, whichever suits your requirements. You may book sessions for one hour for £5.30 (3.30pm - 4.30pm or 4.30pm - 5.00pm / 4.30pm - 5.30pm when booked in conjunction with an Enrichment Club), two hours for £10.60 (3.30pm-5.30pm).

Reporting Absences

To report your child absent please do so by telephoning the school and choosing Option 1 to leave a message on the absence line. You can also report an absence through the Gateway app.





Should I keep my

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Are you entitled?

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
