Year 1— Mrs Keast

Year One have been rhyming this week as we began our new English text, *Oi Frog!* By Kes Gray and Jim Field. We loved the story and the funny rhyming objects that the animals all sat on. We have had a go at acting out part of the story and have been matching pairs of rhyming words.

In Maths this week we have been learning how to add on using a number line. We have been writing lots of addition number sentences and have also been independently drawing some part-whole models and ten frames to represent the addition.

In Science, we have had great fun exploring Autumn. Our new learning focus is 'Seasonal Changes' and we encountered Autumn first-hand this week by going on a nature walk and finding natural objects to make a nature crown.

Monday's History Day was great fun and we created some lovely firework pictures as part of our learning about Guy Fawkes.





Year 2—Mr Slocombe

What a great first week back in Year 2!

It was fantastic to immerse ourselves in history on Monday, a great opportunity to learn about interesting and relevant parts of the past. In the morning, we learnt about the origins of Bonfire Night and why it is still celebrated.

We thought about the timeline of events and created a storyboard to show the sequence. We were interested to look at images of Winkleigh from the past and present, matching them and noticing similarities and differences. This led us to think about how transport has evolved through time, particularly the last 100 years.

We also learnt more about Remembrance and why it is a significant date in British history, creating our own poppy wreath to lay at the war memorial on Monday.

Finally, in the afternoon, we were joined by Simon and Cath from Devon Shippon who led a brilliant workshop around pre-history. The children had the opportunity to handle a range of artefacts and create their own clay pots!

The rest of the week has seen us begin our new sequences across the curriculum.

Year 3— Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

Year 3s have and a good week back. The look like they have had a rest and they are up and ready for more learning!

They began with a history day. They had artefacts to look at and describe and had the chance to really investigate what they thought each was for. They will be studying Egyptians this half term, we only teach the tip of what can be learnt so please encourage them to do some research at home.

They loved the Skate boarding on Wednesday. A huge thank you to Mr Walter for arranging it and Adam for making it such fun. Adam said they were the best class of '1st timers' he had had and loved that they had an hour and a half to experiment.

They have begun their new sequence on Paddington. This has been very funny watching them watch the old Paddington TV programmes. They will be learning how to use stop start animation in computing, so it links beautifully with that. They are loving the different way to use narrative language and there has been much opportunity to discuss the historic nature of

Paddington Bear, especially as he even predates me!







Year 4—Mr Walter

Year 4 have engaged brilliantly to our English sequence this week of *Varjak Paw*. We have read the first 4 chapters and have discussed the characters who have been introduced so far. We have ranked these characters in order based on different characteristics for example the strongest, kindest and most respected.

In maths, we have started our multiplication and division sequence by focussing on different representations of the 3 and 6 times tables.

On Monday, we enjoyed our history day looking into artefacts from the past by guessing what we thought the use was. Thank you Mrs Bourner for organising the mystery box for us to enjoy.

We also reminded ourselves in the importance of remembrance day.

It was fantastic to have the opportunity to skateboard again, all the children had smiles and their faces and worked amazingly together to support others to try their best.

Next week, we have (weather permitting) a football afternoon alongside Year 3 to celebrate our PE learning and curriculum. It would be great to see as many spectators as possible.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

It has been fantastic to welcome back the children after half term!

In Maths and have been learning about fractions. We have been finding equivalent fractions to both unit and non- unit fractions and have started to convert improper fractions to a mixed number fraction.

In English, we have continued to use our book *Kensukes Kingdom* and the children have created their own origin story to how Kensuke ended up on the Island.

On Monday, we had our History day and spent the morning investigating mystery items and the children had to think about what it was and what it would be used for. We then looked at explaining why we thought this to the class and offering reasons why.

In the afternoon we took part in some Victorian style PE and the children started to compare PE lessons in Victorian times to now.

On Thursday, we took part in our skateboarding session, the children really enjoyed learning and practicing new skills. They really enjoyed the workshop and getting the chance to try something different.

Year 6—Miss McLean

In English this week, Year Six have started a sequence of learning focused on the book 'My Secret War Diary' by Marcia Williams. They were intrigued when they found out that the book is a publication of a real diary kept by a 9-year-old through the war that was found in an attic. So far, we have read about the girl's family situation and the evacuees that have come to stay on the estate that she is living on.

In maths, we have finished off our sequence on position and direction by translating and reflecting polygons across all 4 quadrants. We will move on to fractions next week.

Our new sequences in the remaining subjects have also started this week. The children have been most excited to begin learning about the Tudors in history. This week, we started by looking at the family tree. We have started our electricity learning in science by recalling prior knowledge from Year Four, thinking about the symbols that are used when drawing circuit diagrams.

Finally, the highlight of the week was the skateboarding workshop on Thursday morning. The children had a brilliant session developing their skating skills and practicing some new tricks.

Wraparound Care

Flexible before and after school care available Monday to Friday each week during term time, with nutritious breakfasts and healthy snacks provided as well as appropriately supervised fun activities and games. Everybody is welcome, from Nursery to Year 6 with a range of different activities to suit the different age groups.

Early Birds

Early Birds Breakfast Club runs from 7.45am to 9.00am everyday. You may book as many days as you require. There are two options to choose, either with breakfast for £5.30 per session, or without breakfast for £4.30 per session.







All Sorts

All Sorts After School Club runs from 3.30pm to 5.30pm every day. You may book regular or ad-hoc sessions, whichever suits your requirements. You may book sessions for one hour for £5.30 (3.30pm - 4.30pm or 4.30pm - 5.00pm / 4.30pm - 5.30pm when booked in conjunction with an Enrichment Club), two hours for £10.60 (3.30pm-5.30pm).

Should I keep my

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Are you entitled?

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
